### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE

We have 35 total registered students, which includes a total of 16 for First Communion (5 remain ready from 2020, 6 new Grade Two and 5 slightly older; and 6 in Grade eight who will be preparing for Confirmation. There is still time to register your child(ren) especially for their Sacrament Years, but remember every year, every learning experience, contributes to their understanding of our Faith and the Sacraments.

Angie MacDonald and Marijke Blok are remaining with the Sacrament years. At Present, the plan for First Reconciliation/Communion is to use the home study packets we used to review this past years class for First Communion, and create one for Reconciliation, to be available online or by email, and hopefully after the New Year, when restrictions are eased a bit, to have small, in person sessions to review and reinforce, then proceed as we did with the last group, in smaller groups over a few Masses. Marijke feels that the Confirmation students, being older, will benefit more from peer interaction, and she will be contacting registered families with a plan for group gatherings when that becomes possible, hopefully soon after the First of the New Year.

Two other previous teachers have volunteered their time and abilities when we are again able to meet. After the New Year, the non-sacrament classes will be home study packets, based on the "Be My Disciple" lessons, in two age ranges rather than the individual grade related classes. Any suggestions for online content, as well as questions about the program, are most welcome, and volunteers will still be needed when we can return to gatherings.

Until that time, we are posting weekly lessons based on Advent, and daily projects based on the Jesse Tree tradition, these are available on the Holy Spirit Parish Faithbook page; and through the Holy Spirit Religious Education Facebook group for registered families, or via e-mail for registered families without access.

### St. Brendan's Mission Church and Hall

Last November, parishes received letters informing us that our insurance rates were going up. This seems to be the norm across the board... a friend of mine said that his house insurance went up 30 %! We know that in today's climate insurance is a must. In our own community, we are paying insurance on three buildings not in use. The former St. Augustine's Church building and the mission church and hall of St. Brendan's, Dipper Harbour. No services have been held at St. Brendan's since 2016; St. Augustine's September 2018.

The only active connection that I had with Dipper Harbour was with Chris Meneer who kept an eye on the buildings. However, she notified me that she and her husband sold their home and were moving to Sussex at the end of November. Last fall, I drove down to St. Brendan's to check on it (insurance requires that abandoned building be checked every 3 days). When I opened the door, my heart sunk...the ceiling had collapsed: tiles, plaster and insulation everywhere. In December, "Lobster Boys," a fishing processing business in Dipper Harbour, called me and offered to purchase St. Brendan's Hall for \$10, 000.00. They have been buying up property surrounding the church and hall. Included in this deal was a proposal to take down the church and clean up the property (valued at \$20-30 thousand). I asked them to write up a proposal so that I could present to both the Revitalization and Finance Committee. Having placed a notice on the door of the church with parish phone number to see if there was any interest in discussing the future of these building, I received no calls. Therefore it was the recommendation of both committees that we accept this offer, placing the \$10,000 into a separate bank account for ongoing care for St. Brendan's Cemetery. A monument will be placed where the church stood and at the same time freeing up more space for the cemetery. This proposal and action was fully supported by Bishop Riesbeck. In mid-December, all religious items were removed from the building, including a beautiful painting of St. Brendan which will be refurbished and hung in the foyer of St. Rose Worship Site.

In the Book of Ecclesiastes, we are reminded that, "there is a time for everything under heaven... a time to build up and a time to tear down..." The time is now. St. Brendan was an Irish monk who served God by sailing the high seas in search of pastoral opportunities. Brendan is the patron saint of sailors, travellers and adventurers. He took the "church" out to the people. May we continue to follow his example of openness and desire to serve as we move forward in gratitude for the memories and the faith that was nourished by this little mission Church that bore his name.
