### Staying Steady Through These Tough Times

#### “HOPE”

*“As for me, I will always have hope: I will praise you more and more.” Ps71:14*

Our tradition during Lent is to take away anything that may cause us distractions in our Liturgies... a barren space to worship. This includes plants! However, we must ‘work within our footprint.’ I am reminded of a plant (climbing clematis) found at the ‘exit doors on your right of St. Rose Worship Site.’ All other plants were moved for the season of Lent, except for this one. The tendrils of this ivy have climbed up the wall and onto a window and anything else close by. Ivy plants in general are strong and hearty and almost unbreakable and they grip the surface so tightly that only the most determined effort can dislodge them. At my great grandparent’s home, a large farmhouse, an ivy occupied one side and part of the front. For many years it weathered the extremes of both heat and cold without withering and falling away.

When we place our hope in God, we are clinging to God in the same retentive way that ivy clings to a wall or building. When the sun is warm and the rain is gentle, we grow strong and hearty, reaching and moving as we strengthen our grip on God’s never-failing love. Then when the strong wind blows and the rain beats at us, when the sun scorches our leaves and we feel dry and parched to the root, we know that we can hang on. We cannot be moved.

*Mighty God, help us to cling to You like ivy clings to a building.*

## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE – FEBRUARY 2021

We started posting and sending out home study modules the first week in January, one packet for grade 1-5, a second for Grade 6-8, as well as weekly postings for preschool activities and bible stories for the younger family members, and feedback so far has been positive. These lessons, especially for the younger ages require more parental and family involvement, but, especially these days with limited access to organized Church activities that may be a bonus!

The study packets for First Reconciliation and First Communion have also been delivered. These are the same lessons we used last year as a review for the First Communion students who had had some in person teaching, but needed to refresh before receiving the Sacrament. We also used a questionnaire format to assess their readiness, and it seemed to work well.

During the upcoming Lenten Season, we will be posting much more frequent lessons and activities, both on the Holy Spirit Faithbook page, and in the Religious Education Group for registered students; probably not daily, but similar-to the posts during the first months of the pandemic, before we regained some structure and control in our lives.

We are still accepting registration for students. We currently have a total of 42 students, and are trying to collect names to see who is actively following the program at this time. !2 are receiving the lessons via e-mail, but there is no way of knowing without feedback how many are using the posted lessons.

### Holy Spirit Women's Society Harbour View High School Sunshine Café & Sunshine Room

The Sunshine Café and Sunshine Room at HVHS is designed to help students in need with essentials they wouldn't otherwise have, such as a warm lunch and appropriate school supplies. HVHS would like to thank parishioners for keeping them in your thoughts and prayers, and especially for the kind donations received this fall and at Christmas. The donated school supplies collected in September were put to good use early in the school year. In December the Women's Society provided the school with a generous bag of crafted items. Some of the hats, mitts, and scarves were distributed before Christmas, and more recently offered to any student in need of staying warm when temperatures were well below freezing. During this Lenten season, the Women's Society is asking both worship sites for donations of non-perishable food items that can be turned into healthy, filling, hot lunch options: **soup broths, canned beans (black, kidney, pinto, white, etc. for chilli and soups), evaporated milk, rice, coconut milk, canned vegetables, dried legumes (barley, lentils, etc. ) plain tomato sauces, tomato juice** (they have a good supply of pasta & cereal at this time), **as well as dry goods such as dish soap, plastic spoons, paper plates, cups and bowls, snack bags/sandwich bags, aluminum foil and saran wrap.**

**They are not able to accept any items containing nuts, or any home-baked goods.** Also, there is often a shortage of gloves/mitts for boys (Men's sizes S-XL) and they would be gladly accepted at any time.

Our theme for Lent 2021 is **HOPE**. Let's help give students in need at HVHS some hope by showing others care about them.
