Sixth Week of Easter

John's Gospel offers us comfort and peace in a very direct way for the **6th Sunday of Easter**. Jesus says "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid."

Thursday much of the world will celebrate **Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord**, while the rest will celebrate it the following Sunday.

Our Easter season readings from **Acts of the Apostles** continue this week. We read of Paul converting a wealthy cloth trader, Lydia; of the dramatic conversion and baptism of the jailer and his family; Paul's bold speech to the crowd at the Areopagus and his fearless preaching in Corinth, despite the growing threat from the Jews. We also see how followers of Paul catch the fire of his faith and now begin to convert others.

In **John's Gospel**, we realize we are approaching Pentecost in a few weeks as Jesus begins to speak of his leaving the earth and of the coming of the "Advocate" - the Spirit of Truth. The image of the Trinity is clear: "when the Advocate comes whom I will send you from the Father...." To his disciples, the idea of his leaving fills their hearts with grief but Jesus reassures them, "it is better for you that I go" so that the Spirit can come to them. The Spirit "will guide you to all truth." Jesus promises, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you will weep and mourn, while the world rejoices; you will grieve, but your grief will become joy." "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you." "Whatever you ask the Father in my name he will give you."

Whether the **Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord** is celebrated this Thursday or on Sunday, it is a stirring story from **Acts of the Apostles** of Jesus leaving his disciples and promising them the support of the Holy Spirit. The **Gospel of Luke** tells of Jesus as he led his disciples out "as far as Bethany, raised his hands, and blessed them. As he blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven."

Daily Prayer This Week

We sometimes keep the idea of the Trinity firmly in our heads, rather than move it to our hearts. Our logical, practical minds cannot make sense out of three persons in one God.

But clearly this week Jesus wants us to have some sense of what the Trinity is - a continuation of the seamless love and identity between him and the Father. It is the Spirit of that love between them that lives on in us today, guiding us and helping us to follow the message of Jesus' life. It is that Spirit of Jesus that is with us in each of the difficult and joyous moments of our days.

Jesus invites us to discover the power of the Spirit in our lives through an awareness of "the Advocate" supporting us each day. Jesus encourages us in the same kind of intimate relationship he has with the Father. The startling idea of this close, personal conversation one might have with a parent, models for us how we can speak to him.

If we feel tongue-tied or don't know where to begin, that is exactly the place to start. Each morning as we awaken, we can speak from our hearts.

Loving Jesus, I'm not sure how to do this. I can feel in my heart an emptiness or longing for something deeper in my relationship, but I don't always know where to begin. Help me to open my heart to you this day, and to carry with me the sense of how much you love me and how much you want this kind of personal relationship with me.

Let me feel your Spirit present with me as I face the challenges of the day and let me live my life this day as your follower, in the peace of your love.

It is a simple prayer and one that we can remember as we go about our day, head to a meeting, stand in the kitchen or fold laundry. It is not complicated to have a closer relationship with God but it takes focus. And always, we can end our day with a simple prayer of thanks for the many blessings of the day.

Jesus ascended into heaven, leaving us with the gift of the Spirit - a comfort and accompaniment for our journey. Let us turn to Jesus in our daily life and trust that we are not alone and ask for the graces we need to love as we have been loved.

Resurrection at Holy Spirit Parish

With the budding of trees, the greening of the grass and the new flowers breaking through the ground, all point to 'resurrection'. We see 'resurrection in the face of a new baby and their happy families. We see 'resurrection in the faces of old friends meeting for the first time after a two year break. A resurrection is happening at Holy Spirit Parish-our community is coming back to life after the long pause caused by the pandemic. While we are not totally out of the woods with the virus, vaccines have made it possible for us to return to gathering and many more people have returned to attend our liturgies again.

Throughout the past year, I have been counting the number of attendees at each Mass. Our lowest number of people attending happened this past January with a total of 88 parishioners for all three masses. After that 'lull' and the lifting of restrictions, people began to return. During Holy Week we had over 500 people in attendance (combination from Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday). We had many of our regular parishioners return and we welcomed some visitors. Also new families who have moved here from other parts of Canada have been welcomed into our fold. Many people have shared with me that they had missed their church and the Mass, that they were doing everything else (with caution), why not Mass? They also shared that something was missing such as 'praying with the worshipping community'. The Easter celebrations, with music, song, and energy drew them into new beginnings.

Last week, you received the "Holy Spirit Accountability Report for 2021" which gave you a look at faith community at work, spreading the Gospel message. Copies are available at the entrance of both worship sites and on our parish website. It is remarkable to see the amount of work that has been accomplished even as we navigate our way through the current pandemic.

In Act of of the Apostles the early converts to Christianity dedicated themselves to four things: "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers." (Acts 2:42). While we can serve (Women's Group, Knights of Columbus, Alpha to name but a few) we can pray together, even for our shut-ins or those who are still cautious about gathering. The fullness of the Christian experience requires people be present together in person. We have known the painful time of separation - and rightly so - to get through the danger the virus posed before vaccines were available. With many vaccinated, taking on regular chores such as groceries and banking, many people have heard the call to come and pray and thankfully are returning.

With this in mind, I want to share with you an event that the Revitalization Committee is planning. On **July 23rd**, the Revitalization Committee with be gathering at **St. Matthew's Worship Site Hall** with the chair of all the other committees (along with 2 support members) to discuss how to continue to build up our parish and discern what direction we want to move in to best serve our community. **This meeting is IMPORTANT.** Yes, it will mean sacrificing a Saturday, but hopefully you will look at this as an investment in our parish.

Along with all committees and parishioners, our Revitalization Committee is committed to rebuilding our parish with both worship sites and exploring new ways to be Church. The pause of the pandemic caused many of us to realize how important Holy Spirit Parish community is, and it gave us the space and time away from what we "normally do" to explore other avenues to bring the Gospel out into the world.

We are Holy Spirit Parish... if we allow our 'namesake' to move us, hopefully we will not emerge from the tomb like Lazarus-bound and tied up, but like Jesus, filled with the Spirit of God, transformed and empowered to go beyond what we were before.

We are glad for everyone who has returned and for the new people who have joined us! Resurrection is happening at Holy Spirit Parish. Our doors are opened and everyone is always welcomed. It's great to be back!

"Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and kindle in us the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit and we shall be created. And You will renew the face of the earth."
