St. Augustine's Memorial Garden



How we arrived here ... St. Augustine's church was closed in 2018 when the three parishes of St. Augustine's, St. Matthew's, and St. Rose were merged, to form Holy Spirit Parish. In 2021 the building was demolished, with a plan to create a memorial garden in the footprint of St. Augustine's church. A year has passed since demolition, which allowed the ground to sufficiently settle. Now on to the next steps...

This past winter, 4 landscaping companies were contacted to provide designs and quotes for the garden project. The chosen company is Lawrence Landscaping. The proposed design is in the form of a Celtic cross. There will be a bench placed on each "arm" of the cross (the cost of the benches is not included in the garden quote). In the centre of the cross there will be 3 large boulders representing the Trinity. In the middle of the boulders we are hoping the place the cross from the top of St. Augustine's, which survived the demolition and can be seen in the above photo. The boulders may be used to support plaques, such as an etching of St. Augustine's, the history of the church, and a list of donors. Perennial plants will be chosen and added in and around the cross and boulders, so as to be attractive to pollinators. The old asphalt from the back driveway will be removed, and the entire property will be surrounded by beautiful hedges, with maple trees lining the edge leading to the cemetery. It will be a warm, welcoming, and peaceful spot for one and all.

The garden will have a cost of \$26,000 before tax. It will be carried out in 3 phases, to begin this spring and to be completed in 2025. Details on the phases will be coming soon.

The money to finance this project will come from donations, grants, and fundraising events.

Ideas for income:

- ❖ Applications for available grant money will be made to both the Town of Grand Bay-Westfield and Crane Mountain Enhancement Inc., as well as any other existing grant opportunities.
- ❖ Donors will be sought to purchase items such as trees, benches, boulders, etc., in memory of a family member, loved one, or simply through spiritual generosity. A plaque(s) will be incorporated in the garden to identify donors.
- * Corporate or local business sponsorship will be investigated.
- ❖ Fundraising ideas or suggestions will be sought out.
- Parish contributions





Daily Prayer This Week

This is potentially a powerful week for entering into how available Jesus is for us. He promises to be with us, to make us one with him, even to make his home in us. He promises to keep us safe and to bring us to our true home to be with him forever. The opportunity we have this week is to accept this offer of deepening our relationship with our Lord. We accept it if we let his availability to us seep more and more deeply into our consciousness each day. We do this by beginning each day focusing our first thoughts of the day in a simple recognition that we are not alone: "Thank you for this day, Lord. I know you want to stay close to me, to guide me and support me today. I need some real strength and courage to face some of the challenges of this day. Help me to keep connecting with you throughout this day, to remember your presence and love." This 20 second prayer will open our day to a Lord who invites us to surrender our troubles to him.

At various times of the day - especially when we approach a particularly challenging responsibility, or an occasion or situation in which we habitually lose our peace or give in to temptation - we can be renewed by another 20 second prayer. Each time we turn to the Lord, our "moment of connection" can become more specific, more intimate, and more confident.

If we find ourselves sidetracked and distracted all day, or for several days, it is easy to get right back on track by pausing, while doing almost anything, and asking our Lord to remind us of his constant presence. We will quickly return to a sense that Jesus knows us, understands us, and wants to be with us in whatever troubles our hearts. And, each night, when we give thanks to our Lord for his fidelity to us throughout the day, we will be given the grace to know, again, that we are never alone.

We are rejoicing in this Easter season and asking God to shower us with the light of salvation that John's Gospel refers to so often. Even now, weeks after Easter, we rejoice!
